## PAINTS oil:

(Follow also for Acrylic and Gouache. )
Cad yellow light
Cad yellow deep
Yellow ochre
Cad orange
Quinacridone rose or permanent rose. Ultra blue
Manganese blue hue
Viridian green (Not viridian hue.)
Chroma black
Titanium white
Try to use artist grade paints (Gamblin or M Graham etc) Please no student grade or craft paints

## Palette.

The bigger the better. Strip-off palettes are great. Please NO egg cartons or Styrofoam meat trays.

## BRUSHES

Good quality bristle brushes. No Dollar store brushes. 2,4,6,8,10, Flats.
1-3" cheap big bristle brush for blending.
\#1 or 2 taklon liner brush
Small amount of q-tips., keep in a zip lock bag.

## Brush washer,

A good metal leak proof bush washer is a very good item to invest in. You will thank me for
it. Odourless gamsol nor Eco house solvent.
For acrylic, yogurt containers with a kitchen scratchy in the bottom to help remove paint from the brush.

## CANVAS

4-5 canvases $6 \times 8$ to $12 \times 16$, unless your fast and super comfortable with bigger then stick to smaller sizes.

Extra's
-Sketchbook for thumb-nails and taking notes.
-Blue shop towels (hardware store)
-Garbage bags (Safeway bag)
